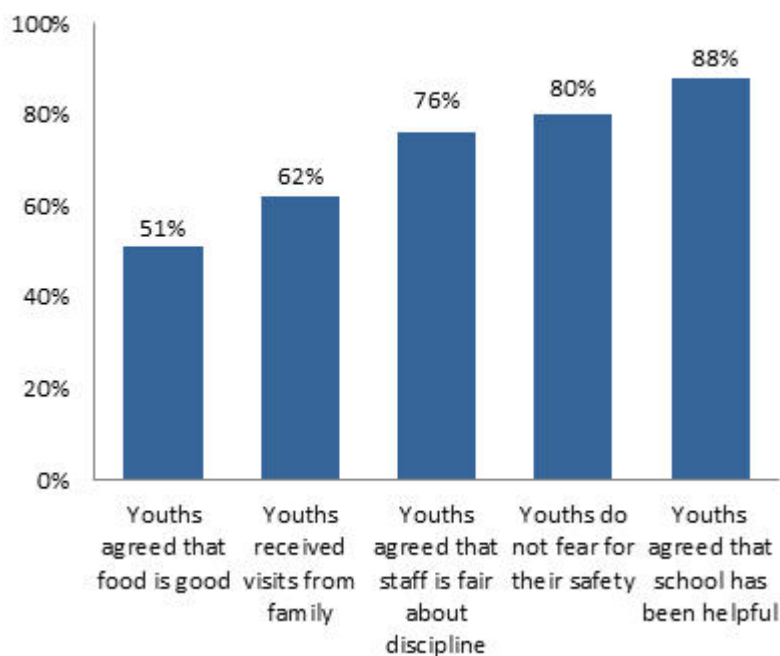
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## What Youths Say Matters: Positive Experiences Lead to Positive Outcomes

Performance-based Standards (PbS) released a new issue brief entitled "What Youths Say Matters." The issue brief highlights that youths' perceptions are essential to gain insight about what's really happening in facilities and research supports that youths who have positive experiences in custody are less likely to recidivate when released.
